On a cold cloudy morning on Thursday the 15th of September, 14 riders from the Goldfield musters rode into the Merredin Men's Shed yard complex having left Perth that morning on route to Kalgoorlie.

The riders, led by Gary Pontifex and supported by Neami Nationals, were making the ride to promote the Kalgoorlie Health Step Up/Step down service.

The Neami Nationals is a community mental health service supporting people to improve their health, live independently and pursue a life based on their own strengths, values, and goals.

Their services extend in diverse communities ranging from inner suburbs to regional and remote areas and use what's termed a collaborative recovery approach to support people.

Ideals that reinforce the principles of what the Men's Shed stand for and try to achieve in their own way in the Merredin Community.

The Shed members met the riders and hosted them to a lunch of two choices of soup and fresh pizza followed by cake desserts

The lunch was prepared by two wonderful ladies in Julie Nicoletti and Audiene McCrae, a real treat much appreciated by the guests and Shed members.

Following lunch, an enlightening address was given by Damien Roper from the Neami Nationals exposing the values and objectives that affect many of our lives, and as menfolk the simple task of asking RUOK, the need to talk through your

mental thoughts and drawing attention to mental health.

The visit finished off with the guests touring the Shed premises, having a group photo taken and then they were on their way again.

Members from the church opened their homes for everyone to get a warm shower after their long ride. One of the riders made a comment that they had never been fed so well, but I think if you are very hungry like most of them were any food is great food. About Ride for Compassion

Ride for Compassion is an annual event in which cyclists and support crew—with a desire to help children living in poverty—raise money for Compassion Australia. All funds raised are used to support Compassion's Critical Needs to help children living in poverty in developing countries. In 2022, a month-long ride will travel across Australia from coast to coast.

Poverty has a devastating impact on children, taking away their chance to learn and play, and instead exposing them to exploitation, violence or even death. Compassion is an international Christian ministry with over six decades of experience that equips over



These recipes are from the Merredin Mercury and Central Districts Index 1944.

The good old sausage definitely puts on party airs in this intriguing recipe... and what a saving on your meat coupons!

ALL BRAN SAVOURY CREAM MUFFINS


Moisten ½ cup Kellogg's All Bran with 1 cup milk. Sift 1½ cups self-raising flour with 1 teaspoon salt or celery salt and a few grains cayenne. Rub in 1 tablespoon shortening and 1 tablespoon finely grated cheese. Add soaked All Bran

mixing to a moist dough. Roll to ½ inch thickness and cut with floured knife or round cutter. Bake on greased baking tray in hot oven for 10 to 12 minutes, or on preheated greased gridle over moderate heat. Grill, bake or fry 1lb sausages then slice Melt 1 tablespoon thinly. shortening in saucepan, stir in 1 tablespoon flour and cook for a few minutes. Add 2 cups meat stock or water, stirring until mixture boils and thickens. Add sliced sausages, 1 tablespoon grated cheese, 1 tablespoon chopped parsley and season to Simmer for a few minutes before serving with the split hot muffins.






Fire Danger Ratings describe the potential level of danger should a bushfire start.

They are important because they provide people with information so that they can take action to protect themselves and others from the potentially dangerous impacts of bushfires.

Launched on 1 September 2022, the new Australian Fire Danger Rating System is a simplified, action-oriented Fire Danger Rating System.



- The AFDRS also introduces 'No Rating' for days where bushfires are unlikely to spread in a dangerous or lifethreatening way. On these days you still need to remain alert and abide by local seasonal laws and regulations.
- The AFDRS is informed by one of Australia's largest social research projects which found that most Australians did not understand the old system and would prefer a simpler, action-oriented set of Fire Danger Ratings.
- The AFDRS has been implemented consistently across Australia and means that wherever you are across the country, you will be able to understand the threat posed on any given day and make appropriate decisions to keep you and your family safe.







MERREDIN COMMUNITY MEN'S SHED CHANGES AT THE SHED

On Thursday 8th October, 22 members of the Merredin Men's Shed met for the Annual General Meeting.

Going into the meeting there was a degree of anticipation as there were no nominations for the Executive positions. The previous President and Deputy in Phill Sachse and Peter McCrae had made it clear that they would be standing down from the respective positions having both served out their term.

The President opened the meeting and following through the agenda presented his report on the activities of the year. He highlighted the voluntary work carried out in assisting the Shire in the Gateway Festival, the Railway Museum in their 50year celebrations, the Anzac Day morning teas, and the bimonthly Merredin CRC market days. He also complimented members Campbell Lawson and Dennis Scaddan for the service in running the train at various events.

Some of the major projects were again in the cropping on the reserve north of town where the Shed were successful in negotiating an extension of

their lease for another 5 years from the Shire of Merredin. The past crop was above expectation and yielded just under 2.5 tonnes per hectare.

The importance of the crop is reflected in the Shed finances as the Shed is almost totally selffunded. Phil went on to mention that this current crop looks even better. All of this is made possible by the generous assistance given by, firstly, member Peter McCrae who basically donates the seed and machinery to do the cropping and, secondly, by sponsors Nutrien Ag for fertilizer and chemicals, by Great Southern Fuels for diesel and others for their help. The contribution of the sponsors who assist the Shed was later reinforced by Langley Smith.

Other areas of activity were in the workshop, where the restoration of the McDonald roller x Shire and Chamberlain tractor for the mining giant Mineral Resources was finally finished and transported to site at Koolyanobbing.

Other areas of interest were in recycling of cans and bottles. This returned revenue of more than \$3000 from which over \$1000 was donated to the RFDS.

Phil finished his report by acknowledging the Life Membership awarded earlier in the year to Peter McCrae and certificates of appreciation awarded to Dennis Scaddan, Sam Teasdale, and Malcolm Robartson.

The anticipated election was conducted by Grant Bennett called on as returning officer. The results were Ross Duffield elected as President with his Deputy in Dennis Scaddan. They will head up a team of 7

members that make up the Management Committee. The Executive and Committee are elected for a two-year term.

The Meeting progressed by passing a motion regarding membership fees as required to be set at an AGM.

There was no other business, and the Chair congratulated the newly elected Members and wished them well for the coming year.

On behalf of all of us at the Railway Museum, we wish to sincerely thank the *Merredin* **Bootscooters** for their support and look forward to hosting them for a visit.



Astronomy

WTF 8TH SEPTEMBER - 21ST SEPTEMBER 2022

Welcome to the Autumnal Equinox edition of WTF, even though it is about as far from autumn as it is possible to get.

The September event is so named because of the hegemony of the Northern Hemisphere, who think they own the sky, and that they are "up" and we in the Southern Hemisphere are "down", which will be particularly ironic tomorrow, the 23rd, when the sun leaves them for dead at exactly 9:03am and won't return to them for a full six months.

Skywatching this fortnight is enhanced by the absence of the

moon. Jupiter comes into exact opposition on Sunday 25th. The big gas giant rises as the sun sets and totally dominates the sky until sunrise. Saturn is now almost overhead at sunset and the centre of the Galaxy is also still spread across the Western sky.

Mercury completes its inferior conjunction and begins to race away from us at increasing speed. By the end of the fortnight, it will be easy to spot low in the East an hour before sunrise.

It can be seen from the tables that Venus is now almost stationary in relation to us as it comes within seven minutes of superior conjunction by the end of the fortnight.

Mars is moving a little faster but still seems to be suffering stage fright as it gradually inches toward opposition on December 8th.

Those of you looking forward to a trip to Mars may be interested to learn that Monday 26th is launch window day. If your spacecraft does not depart for Mars on this day, you will not get another opportunity until October 17th, 2024. A launch on any other day will miss the target or use more fuel than you can carry. Mars launch windows occur only every two years roughly.

Although it is true to say that the most spectacular viewing targets such as the Magellanic clouds, Carina, Scorpio and the Southern Cross are here in the southern hemisphere, there are a few celestial jewels that reside in the deep North, and we must wait for the right time of the year to see them. I'm referring of course to the Andromeda and Triangulum galaxies.

As the square of Pegasus takes its place in the Northern sky, so Andromeda rises above the Northern horizon enough to get some long exposure shots. This week you may spot it close to true North after 9:30pm. Good Luck! Keep looking up!






